1. PLANNING MEETING IN JUNE OR EARLY JULY.
 - a. SCOUTMASTER
 - b. TROOP LEADERSHIP COUNCIL
 - c. NEED TO HAVE OTHER CALENDARS PRESENT.
 - i. SADDLEBACK SCHOOL DISTRICT
 - ii. CAPO SCHOOL DISTRICT
 - iii. SADDLEBACK DISTRICT B.S.A.
 - d. **ONE CAR CAMPOUT PER MONTH**
 - e. **BACKPACKS INSERTED IN ALSO.**
 - f. PICK ACTUAL DATES FOR ALL OUTINGS.
2. SCOUTMASTER PRESENTS CALENDAR TO TROOP COMMITTEE.
 - a. "MAKE IT HAPPEN"
3. THE CALENDAR IS PRINTED AND DISTRIBUTED TO ENTIRE TROOP.
 - a. **ONCE DATES ARE SET:**
 - i. **DON'T CHANGE THEM EXCEPT FOR RESERVATION PROBLEMS.**
 - ii. **TROOP FAMILIES MUST LEARN TO TRUST THE CALENDAR TO PLAN WHICH TRIPS THEY WISH TO ATTEND.**
4. THE T.L.C. SELLS IT TO THE SCOUTS
 - a. PUSHES FOR HIGH TURNOUTS.
 - i. **IT IS NOT ALWAYS THE DESTINATION THAT MAKES AN OUTING FUN BUT RATHER IT IS THE SCOUTS WHO CREATE THE FUN.**
 - ii. ALL TROOP MEMBERS ARE EXPECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN A MAJORITY OF THE FUNCTIONS.

5. 60 DAYS PRIOR TO A CAMPOUT.
 - a. START COLLECTING YOUR FIRST INTEREST LIST.
 - i. AN ANSWER OF “NO” REQUIRES A QUESTION OF WHY? YOU HOLD YOUR TROOP MEMBERS ACCOUNTABLE.
 - b. ALWAYS GIVE THIS INFORMATION TO THE SCOUTMASTER.
6. 30 DAYS PRIOR TO THE CAMPOUT.
 - a. FIRM UP THE LISTS.
7. 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO THE CAMPOUT
 - a. PLAN YOUR MENU
 - b. MAKE YOUR SHOPPING LIST
 - c. START COLLECTING FOOD MONEY
8. THE WEEK OF THE CAMPOUT.
 - a. FINISH COLLECTING MONEY.
 - i. DON'T GET IN THE HABIT OF PUTTING OUT YOUR MONEY FOR A PATROL MEMBER.
 - b. PERMISSION SLIPS HANDED OUT.
 - c. BUY FOOD THE DAY BEFORE YOU ARE TO LEAVE.
